Elizabeth Deull is an artist who lives and works in New York City. She holds a B.F.A. in Painting from The School of the Art Institute of Chicago, and a Masters in Studio Arts/Painting from New York University's Steinhardt School of Education.

Ms. Deull became an Adjunct Professor of Painting at NYU in 2005. She has also served as a Teaching Assistant in several undergraduate Drawing and Painting courses at NYU to both Painter/Professor John Torreano and Painter/Professor Michael St. John. She worked as a Teaching Artist Assistant in the "Learning Through Arts" Program of The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, instructing at a New York City Public elementary School and developing museum and curriculum linked lesson plans. She also trained with Museum educators at The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and conducted specialized tours for school groups.

Ms. Deull has served as a judge for two years for "The Scholastic Art and Writing Awards". She has executed commissioned paintings and drawings for several private collections, and has designed commercial materials for small businesses. Her work has been exhibited at Marvelli Gallery, The Lower East Side Girls Club, The Rosenberg Gallery and at the 80 Washington Square East Galleries in New York City, and at Gallery 2 in Chicago.
